#### Oxcars and FreeCultureForum 2011 Networks for a R-evolution

#### Three days to think about what the Internet has done for us, and what we can now do for it

2011 is the year when the consciousness of a global network has emerged. The massive and strategic use of social and digital networks has allowed the movement of citizen empowerment to step up a notch, and has facilitated a viral uprising of civil society in many parts of the world. The struggles to defend the Internet have shown to be a fertile breeding ground for such uprisings.

The #15M movement within the **#spanishrevolution** is organized online. By the same token, one of its biggest strengths is the feedback process that happens between the network and the streets, between the internet and the men and women gathering in streets and squares.

# We have to continue promoting, facilitating and improving the efficient use of the Internet to achieve mobilization and direct participation.

During the previous edition of the <u>FCForum</u> it was already discussed that the intense struggles by civil society within the Spanish state to defend the Internet against the Sinde Law (a law to stop downloading) were the starting point for a larger action.

For 3 years now, the <u>OXCARS</u> and the <u>FCForum</u>, held in Barcelona, have provided international meeting spaces in which to build and coordinate common tools for issues regarding free culture and the Internet. The <u>FCForum</u> gathers the main organizations and active voices that are working on such issues, while it is also an open space for all those who wish to understand, deepen and participate in the responses before the pressing challenges that face our connected societies.

This year, the <u>FCForum</u> will focus, inevitably, on the experience of the 15M movement as a case study that can be exported to the global arena.

The intention of the <u>FCForum 2011</u> is for all participants to analyze and build the best tools that the struggle needs at this point, both for its organization and for the impact it aims to have here in Spain, as case of study to be applied more globally.

#### Some of the questions that we will discuss this year are:

0. Which tools and methods of online organization and communication have allowed the emergence of the #15M movement? How can these practices be improved? How have social networks facilitated a change in the respect shown between people from different groups? What dangers threaten the neutral, open Internet which we know and want to preserve, at the local and global levels? How has the Internet facilitated the creation of new ways of producing and spreading culture? How can some of those methods become a way to avoid artists being used as an excuse to privatize the Web? What should we do with SGAE (the main management organization in Spain) now that its directives have been taken to court?

This gathering of 2 days will be preceded, as always, by the <u>OXCARS</u>, the biggest free culture event of all time. A great celebration of free culture that will serve as a warm-up event.

We believe it will be a very useful space for the empowerment of the movement.

We welcome and await you all.

This year we will be helped along in our discussions, amongst many others, by <u>John Perry</u> <u>Barlow</u>, who in 1996 lit the spark with his 'declaration of independence in ciberspace', <u>Alex de la</u> <u>Iglesia</u>, who stepped down from his post as Director of the Film Academy in protest against the Sinde law, as well as many of the hackers and people who have created tools to assist the actions of the 15M movement, such as the network N-1.cc.

John Perry Barlow (Jackson Hole, Wyoming, 1947) is an American poet and essayist, a retired Wyoming cattle rancher, and a former lyricist for the Grateful Dead. He was a co-founder of the Electronic Frontier Foundation along with digital rights activists John Gilmore and Mitch Kapor. He is currently vice-chairman of the EFF's board of directors. Barlow is a member of the International Academy of Digital Arts and Sciences. His writings include "A Declaration of the Independence of Cyberspace" and "The Economy of Ideas".

#### **David Bravo**

David Bravo is a lawyer specializing in intellectual property and computer law.

He has participated in debates and conferences advocating the need to adapt the traditional workings of intellectual property rights to the new uses being made of those rights due to the advent of new technologies.

David Bravo is Pablo Soto's defense attorney, the same Pablo Soto who the recording industry tried to sue for more than 13 million Euros, namely for developing p2p programs as well as links pages and web pages such as, Sharemula, Indicedonkey, Elitetorrent and Spanishare. In the 2006 court case Pablo was sued by industry groups in what was heralded as the "most important operation against piracy in all of Europe", Pablo was acquitted of all charges with the court finding that the activity in question did not constitute a crime. David also represents Spanish artists and musicians handling their negotiations of recording deals. In June 2005 he published "Copy this book" under a Creative Commons license. Between 2006 and 2008, he collaborated in the last two seasons of the program Noche Sin Tregua, presented by Dani Mateo.

With KOLLECTOR the artistic world can track broadcasts of songs throughout the world.

Kollector.com has the technology and the infrastructure to track radio transmissions from all over the world in real time, 24 hours a day.

Kollector.com offers its services via a web platform for anyone who wishes to track broadcasts of a song anywhere in the world.

The process is very simple. The user just uploads the song and selects a tracking package: monthly or annualy subscription.

The purpose of the service is to give rights-holders geographical broadcast statistics, a history of transmissions of their works and the option of drawing up a complete transmission log for each track.

For the first time, songwriters, composers, arrangers and performers can obtain realtimeinformation on the use of their works and forecast any royalties due;

Music publishers can track their whole catalogue at global level and forecast the royalties due for each track they wish to monitor;

Collecting rights societies, with quicker access to full information, can provider faster, more accurate payouts to their members.

Music producers can test the transmissions of their new titles in real time, gaining immediate feedback on the effectiveness of their promotional campaigns.

# **ABOUT FCFORUM**

The FCForum is an international arena in which to build and coordinate action and a shared agenda for issues related to free/libre culture and access to knowledge. The FCForum brings together key organisations and active voices in the sphere of free/libre culture and knowledge, and provides an opportunity to meet and work together on answers to the pressing questions that arise from the current paradigm shift.

Against the powerful copyright industries lobby, the FCForum is a space in which to construct grassroots proposals that can strengthen civil society's position in the debate around the creation and distribution of art, culture and knowledge in the digital era.

The FCForum, which takes place in tandem with the fourth annual oXcars festival, the biggest free/libre culture event of all time; ), is a three-day event of international scope that focuses on organising a united front encompassing solutions and proposals from around the world, so that they can strengthen and complement each other and offer a joint response to the pressure that a sector of the industry exerts on governments.

During the FCForum 2009 we drafted the Charter for Innovation, Creativity and Access to Knowledge, a legal compendium to reform copyright laws, that covers over 20 years of legal proposals aimed at bringing copyright legislation into line with the digital era. It has been adopted as a Magna Carta by many organisations throughout Europe and the USA, and has become an effective tool for thwarting reactionary legislative proposals such as ACTA and Spain's Sustainable Economy Act, among others.

At the FCForum 2010 we created a how-to guide on Sustainable Models for Creativity in the Digital Age as a way of re-thinking the economic structures that have been producing and financing culture up until now. Many of the old models have become outdated and detrimental to civil society. The aim of this document is to promote innovative strategies to defend and extend the sphere in which human creativity and knowledge can thrive freely and sustainably.

# About X.net

**X.net** (previously EXGAE) is specialized in helping citizens against abuses of royalties management societies and cultural industries lobbies.

**X.net** was created as a result of the justified hostility towards some cultural industries lobbies, with the aim of equipping civil society with creative and legal skills to increase their visibility and defend themselves. **X.net** is a platform with non-profit aims. That is: a lot of aims, but no profit at all.

The information brought together on this site is a means to share tools, information and documents that X.net members, as ordinary citizens (based on the professional and personal activities of each member, and the problems they have encountered), have had to create. X.net members want to share these resources with everybody else who find themselves in similar situations, so that they can defend themselves from the abuses of the parts of the cultural industries that are trying to prevent the transition to the digital age by all means possible.

**X.net** dialogues and works with everybody, and firmly believes that existing cultural models from the previous age must be able to coexist with the new models, without trying to set up unfair obstacles for these emerging ones.

X.net focuses on informing and assisting individuals (in Spain, all consumers pay the digital levy that supposedly compensates these organisations for loss of royalties due to new technologies), and, in particular, to provide legal advice to small businesses, artists, authors and producers alike.

Through practice, **X.net** encourages the normalisation of new ways of creating and understanding culture. Alongside the great majority of society, it is committed to defending the right to use alternative forms of circulation of culture.

The horizon we are aiming for is to bring about a change in habits and regulations, in favour of a fairer and more beneficial use of digital resources.

X.net is not a welfare project. X.net invents and puts into practice.

#### X.net works on six fronts:

Providing free information to over 1400 people a year, and maintaining a web site that is visited by around 10,000 people per month, for: Answers to frequently asked questions about copyright, licences, the digital levy and royalties collection societies for artists, producers, venues, businesses, IT stores, etc.. #### Creating viral campaigns

In recent years, X.net has been one of the most active groups in the struggle for civil rights in the digital environment, at the Spanish, European and international levels.

# It has participated in the organization of important milestones for freedoms on the Internet:

- The fight against the Spanish Law of Sustainable Economy (LES) and the founding of RED SOSTENIBLE ;
- The creation of tools for legislative reforms such as the Charter for Innovation, Creativity and Access to Knowledge or the Declaration on Sustainable Models for Creativity in the Digital Era.
- The organization of major mobilisations in 2010, such as the (D') Evolution Summit, which was followed by more than 150,000 people during the European Summit of Ministers of Culture

Internet will Not be another TV jointly with international consumer defence organisations. Some of its activities are financed by the different cultural associations that make up **X.net**.

At the oXcars, everybody who works, is paid.

**X.net** does not receive funding per sé, but we always try to have at least two people who are paid to work part-time. It isn't always possible.

Our platform was created on 2008 and has been made public on 14 April under the name of EXGAE. From the beginning EXGAE has been backed by more than 8000 people.

Today we have an extensive national and international affinity's network.

Below you can read why on November 29, 2010 we changed our name and to La-EX (now X.net) a cause of legal threats.
